Whilst it is always lovely to see so many children take part in the nativities, please remember that if your child has a temperature or is not well enough to last the day, do not send them in just to take part in the play. A reminder also that younger siblings are not permitted as they can be a distraction for the performers.

Change of time for classroom doors closing in the morning and late arrivals

As you know we extended our school day by 10 minutes in September. From January 3rd classroom doors will close at **8:45am** and any arrivals after this time will be recorded as late and must sign in at the school office.

Arriving late can be very unsettling for the children as their learning starts early on in the morning and a child that arrives late can miss out on important sessions of phonics, maths, reading and English. Not only can it be disruptive for the children in class but the latecomers can also feel embarrassed about coming in when the rest of the class is already working.

Reminder about PE kits

Please remember that from the first week back after the holidays, children will be able to come to school in their PE kit on PE days. School jumpers and cardigans should be worn over a yellow top or polo shirt. Track suit bottoms can be worn but must be navy blue or black. Trainers or school shoes (which will then be changed into trainers) can also be worn on these days. This is to help us save some time in our already pressurised weekly timetable.
